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

Final Communication Report

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Executive Summary

This final communication report provides an overview of the communication activities carried out in the fourth and final year of the ELEXIS project, i.e. the period from February 1st 2021 to July 31st 2022. However, since the present report is also to be submitted on July 31st 2022, the authors have agreed on July 20th as the deadline for the reporting of all figures and numbers within this period.

This report is based on the structure of Deliverable D7.8, the third year dissemination and communication report, available here. Due to the fact that objectives, impact, target groups, tailored message(s) and multi-level communication remain as described in D7.5 (here), the authors provide updates on the respective chapters only, i.e. Communication Channels (1), Events (2), Dissemination Material (3), Scientific Dissemination (4) as well as Evaluation, Monitoring and Reporting (5), and include relevant statistics.

Additionally, a full list of scientific publications can be found in the appendix of this report.

1. Communication Channels: LexMeet

Due to the COVID-19 outbreak and the changing communication needs we introduced an additional communication channel: LexMeet.




Figure 1: LexMeet Platform - Discussion Forum, Groups & Organisations

The platform was presented at the eLex2021 (July 2021) and EURALEX 2021 (September 2021) conferences for the first time. The rollout was organised in the course of Autumn 2021, which was accompanied in terms of dissemination and outreach as well: Content was created that is displayed on the ELEXIS EU website, a newsletter was sent (available here) and various social media postings (with the hashtag #MeetELEXIS on Facebook and Twitter) drew attention to the new forum available. LexMeet is a platform for exchanging ideas and expertise about lexicography and other related fields. Due to the lack of valuable networking opportunities in the past year(s), ELEXIS EU connected representatives from different institutions, countries, fields and areas of interest online with the deployment of the LexMeet platform. The forum does not only collect discussions in the field of lexicography, but also allows members to connect with people who are working on similar topics and are sharing similar interests. With the setup of this platform, members of the ELEXIS EU project as well as other stakeholders can be connected and encouraged to keep in touch, brainstorm, debate and share research, provide feedback, etc. (see Figure 1 below).

At the time of writing this deliverable, there are 166 users registered on the platform, contributing to 7 member groups (with 95 topics active) and 91 organisations registered. After the creation of an account, users can browse LexMeet and provide input in the following areas:

Discussions: This section is filled with discussions about 'LexVoc - translation',
 'Tools & Resources' and 'Research';



 Groups are dedicated to discuss (not only) ELEXIS topics, such as the Game of Words app, the ELEXIS data model, or the Elexifier development;

Additionally, participants in the ELEXIS EU project and beyond were <u>invited to participate</u> in three activities that the project team was carrying out via LexMeet, in order to improve the ELEXIS tool Elexifinder, a tool for searching scientific output in lexicography:

- a) to suggest new content for Elexifinder in order to identify lexicographic publications (such as journals, proceedings, books or individual papers) on a national/regional level, in different languages, ideally available via open access;
- b) to help improve the structure of LexVoc, a vocabulary of lexicographic terms, used for (automatic) categorisation and indexing of research publications in Elexifinder; and
- c) to help translate LexVoc from English to other languages.

The LexMeet platform supports sustainability efforts as it will be maintained and used after the end of the ELEXIS project.



2. Events

All community building events, networking events and training events are documented on the project website and accessible at: https://elex.is/all-events/.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic in the first quarter of 2020, we carried out some of our undertakings online if that was possible;

In the reporting period of year 4, from February 1st 2021 to July 20 2022, ELEXIS EU organised a variety of ELEXIS-branded events (see chapters 2.1, 2.2, 5.4.2) and presented (aspects of) the project at conferences for various target audiences in the form of presentations, posters and paper submissions/talks (see chapters 2.3, 4.2 and 4.3). Additionally, experts from the project consortium were hosting ELEXIS-related workshops at training events (co-)organised by ELEXIS. We provide an overview of different types of events attended, organised, and/or supported below.

2.1 ELEXIS Community Building Event in the Fourth Year

The consortium was planning the second ELEXIS event (as it was called in the project proposal), as outlined in D7.6, to be held in Q4 of 2020, in Italy. Due to the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic in early 2020, this event needed to be postponed.

Finally, in early June 2022, the event could take place in Florence, Italy. Representatives of various research departments and institutions all over Europe (ELEXIS observing institutions) were invited to join the ELEXIS consortium members for the ELEXIS Showcase Event - ELEXIS from A to Ω : Outcomes, Sustainability & Afterlife of a new European Lexicographic Infrastructure (see Figure 2): This hybrid event was geared towards encouraging cooperation with representatives of various industries (such as NLP, language technologies, machine translation, dictionary publishers etc.) as well as towards existing observer institutions.

Organised as a two days event, of which one day was spent at the historic Accademia della Crusca, various work package leaders presented their (ongoing) work and focussed on the outcomes of the European Lexicographic Infrastructure as well as its sustainability and afterlife. 2.2 ELEXIS Training Measures in the Fourth Year

In the course of the fourth year, several workshops as well as training events and sessions were planned, and at times carried out in a hybrid way or held virtually. Below, we provide an overview of all training events in year 4:

February 2021:

- EUROLAN 2021, Training School on Linked Data for Linguistics (details available here), organised by the NexusLinguarum COST Action.

The training school was aimed at students, academics, and practitioners to learn the foundations of Linguistic Data Science, these were taught by various ELEXIS researchers. During the course of the training school, the participants were introduced to a wide range of topics: from Semantic Web, RDF, and ontologies, to modelling and querying linguistic data with state-of-the-art ontology models and tools. April 2021:

- LiSeH Spring School 2021 (postponed from April 2020, details available here).

Linked Data & the Semantic Web for Humanities Research gives an introduction to the concepts related to the Semantic Web and Linked Data and provides an overview of semantic web technologies and tools with a special focus on application scenarios in the humanities.



June 2021:

- TALN-RECITAL 2021 conference.

The 2021 edition of this conference took place in Lille from June 28 to July 2, 2021 and included:

- the 28th Conference on Natural Language Processing (in French: Traitement Automatique des Langues Naturelles TALN)
- the 23rd Meeting of Computer Science Student Researchers for NLP (in French: Rencontre des Étudiants Chercheurs en Informatique pour le Traitement Automatique des Langues -RÉCITAL)

ELEXIS researchers offered conference participants a training within the topic of the linguistic linked data cloud; the programme and more details about the conference are accessible here.

- TOTh Training Session 2021.

Within the framework of the TOTh Conference 2021, the training session "Terminology in the Digital Age - The Ontological Turn" aimed to provide participants with theoretical and practical skills that are necessary to build the formal conceptual system of terminology. Protégé was used for building ontologies to open up terminology to the Semantic Web. More information about this event is accessible here.

- Lisbon Summer School in Linguistics 2021.

This training event offered 12 courses in three areas. Area 2 "Terminology and Lexicography" was co-organized by ELEXIS and ELEXIS staff was teaching ELEXIS-relevant topics, i.e. "Linguistic Digital Data in Terminology and Lexicography", as well as a course on "Introduction to Linked Open Data in Linguistics"; more information about the Summer School is accessible here.

- ELEXIS: Al-powered Tools for Lexicographers in the 21st Century.

This virtual event introduced new tools developed by the ELEXIS project to help lexicographers develop dictionaries using state-of-the-art artificial-intelligence-powered tools. The webinar was geared towards working lexicographers and provided practical demonstrations of the tools and how they can be incorporated into a lexicographic workflow. The SMM4H Shared Task features tasks across text classification, named entity recognition (NER) and entity normalisation problems on social media datasets. Researchers had the opportunity to apply state-of-the-art methods on multiple tasks to further validate their research on data from social media. For students and educators, this was an excellent opportunity to teach and apply natural language processing (NLP) techniques by participating in the shared tasks. Each participating team had the opportunity to submit a

The ELEXIS EU partner institution Austrian Academy of Sciences (ACDH-CH) participated in the Long Night of Research 2022 with a linguistic station: How can language be explored digitally, playfully and interactively? The linguists and text researchers of the ACDH-CH invited attendees to explore digitised lexicons, dialect dictionaries and text corpora with interactive games. They gave an insight into how digital linguistics works and how they make their results accessible for research and the interested public. The focus of the workshop PROfiling LINGuistic KNOWledgE gRaphs (ProLingKNOWER) was to reveal novel approaches, methodologies and frameworks on profiling linguistic linked data as well as to highlight tools and user interfaces that can effectively assist different use cases for profiling such data. In addition, the workshop seeks methodologies that help effective profiling in building real-world Linked Data applications leveraging linguistic data, as well as use cases that reveal success stories or aspects that have been neglected so far. ELEXIS co-organised a full-day workshop held in conjunction with LREC 2022 as a hybrid event. The workshop elaborated the theme of linking data across lexicographic resources and with other lexical resources, with the aim of enhancing language data methodologies and applications. - LREC 2022: Workshop on Resources and Technologies for Inidgenous, Endangered and Lesser-Resourced Languages in Eurasia (EURALI).

This workshop focused on the development of language technology resources and tools for the indigenous, endangered and lesser-resource languages in the Eurasia continent. More information about this event is accessible here.

- LREC 2022: Terminology in the 21st century: many faces, many places.

This half-day workshop aimed to provide a discussion forum on the theoretical and methodological approaches that have characterised terminology in recent years. In particular, it focused on its connection to the Linguistic Linked (Open) Data paradigm and to Semantic Web technologies through the use of ontologies and how this promotes the creation of interoperable terminological resources in multiple domains and applications, such as Digital Humanities, e-lexicography, or e-health. The workshop also focused on exploring the advantages and challenges underlying current terminology-related standards, as well as on available resources and case studies. - LREC 2022: 8th WS on linked Data in Linguistics.

The 8th Workshop on Linked Data in Linguistics (LDL-2022): Revisiting a Decade of Linguistic Linked Open Data, co-located with LREC 2022, was co-organized by ELEXIS. The workshop was targeting a wide range of communities such as applied linguistics, lexicography, digital humanities, natural language processing and information technology and provided the primary forum to present and discuss use cases, experiences, best practices, recommendations and technologies of linguistic linked open data in an interdisciplinary setting, addressing topics such as linking language resources, natural language for structured knowledge and structured knowledge for natural language. - LREC 2022: 6th Workshop on Indian Language Data: Resources and Evaluation (WILDRE).

The 6th iteration of the WILDRE workshop series had a special focus on demos of Indian language technology. In the past few years, as more resources have been developed and made available, there has been an increased activity in developing usable technology using these. WILDRE-6 encouraged and widened the Demo track to allow the community to showcase their demos and have mutually beneficial interactions with each other as well as resource developers. Hence, WILDRE-6 included shared tasks for Indian languages: The organisers of shared tasks provided datasets and evaluation platforms to evaluate systems developed by the participants. 1st International Conference on "Multilingual digital terminology today.
 Design, representation formats and management systems".

The 1st International Conference on "Multilingual digital terminology today. Design, representation formats and management systems" aimed to bring together specialists in the disciplines of terminology, terminography, computational terminology, computational linguistics and NLP. Its goal was to share methodological reflections on design approaches, representation formats and management systems of the digital terminology contained in terminological resources. Hence, ELEXIS EU research experts were invited as keynote speakers: Rute Costa held a talk entitled 'Transitions en Terminologie' and Roberto Navigli reflected about 'Ten Years of BabelNet and Beyond'. Lexicom 2022.

Lexicom is an intensive workshop in lexicography and lexical computing. This event was endorsed and supported by ELEXIS, since Sketch Engine (Lexical Computing) is part of the ELEXIS consortium and ELEXIS staff was present at the workshop in various roles. More information can be found here.

- ELEXIS pre-conference workshop at EURALEX 2022.

ELEXIS was organising a pre-conference workshop, co-located with EURALEX 2022, XX International Congress: Dictionaries and Society. The workshop included presentations, discussions, and hands-on work with various ELEXIS tools. The participants were able to use their own data, or use one of the existing ELEXIS datasets. The XX EURALEX International Congress was held in Mannheim, Germany. With its motto "Dictionaries and Society", the conference aimed at bringing together professional lexicographers, linguists, publishers, researchers, software developers and anyone interested in dictionaries and their educational, cultural, political and social impact in everyday life. The fourth edition of Globalex Workshop on Lexicography and Neology was held in conjunction with EURALEX 2022, in Mannheim, Germany. The aim of the GWLN series is to bring together cross-world views combining detection and evaluation methods of neologisms with their lexicographic processing and representation for different languages. GWLN takes place annually with support of the Global Alliance for Lexicography (Globalex), in conjunction with the international conferences of the continental associations for lexicography. 3. Dissemination Material

The distributed dissemination material follows the corporate design guidelines described in D7.1: Visual Identity and Design Manual (available here).

3.1. Online Dissemination Material

Due to the COVID-19 outbreak in 2020, special emphasis was put on the creation of online dissemination material, in order to promote a variety of events and online campaigns, such as calls for papers, available project tools, and grants for research visits. 3.2. Offline Dissemination Material

Next to a limited number of giveaways, such as pens and stickers, print materials were made <u>available for download</u> at the start of the project on the project website. Outreach and engagement are monitored via website analytics (Google Analytics and Matomo, formerly known as Piwik), via the standard reporting features of social media platforms, via the reporting dashboard of the mass mailing tool Mailchimp and via figures/data collected at forms for event registration (e.g. a workshop). In the following sub-chapters, WP7 provides a detailed overview on the status of each respective target outcome in reference to table 2 and 2a.

5.1 Social Media Monitoring Year 4




Figure 4: Follower growth on Facebook & Twitter, February 2021 - July 20, 2022 (Social Media Engagement)

Figure 4 below visualises the growth of ELEXIS EU followers per social media platform in year 4. It is evident that the project could gather more followers on Twitter than on



Facebook: The lexicographic community seems to be more active in publishing academic tweets than posting the same content (in a different way) on Facebook. In addition, many related projects, such as CLARIN and DARIAH are registered users on Twitter, which is a massive help in terms of dissemination and outreach.

Within the last 4 years, ELEXIS EU was able to gather 1372 Followers on Twitter and 883 page followers on Facebook (plus 794 page likes respectively).

Taking into account the indicator from table 2 (objective 1), social media engagement, the overall target to achieve is 5.000 followers by the end of the project.

However, ELEXIS EU managed to collect followers beyond the borders of social media platforms: We are considering as well the number of the members of the LexMeet plattform and ELEXIS EU newsletter subscribers (see chapter 5.3) for the calculation of the targeted outcome. Additionally, we are taking into account the number of Twitter and Facebook followers from *SketchEngine*, since it is both an ELEXIS tool and an ELEXIS consortium partner institution.

Table 2b below summarises the calculations made for the key performance indicator social media engagement and visualises that the target outcome (8.294) is 'satisfactory'.

5.1.1 Twitter Analysis

In the course of year four, ELEXIS EU published 577 tweets and gained 347 new followers on Twitter. Table 3 below provides an overview of published tweets, impressions and follower growth per month in the fourth year.

The number of tweets per month in table 3 indicates that ELEXIS EU tweeted most frequently in the context of lexicographic events, i.e. in April, July and September 2021:

In April 2021, the (postponed) <u>LiSeH Spring School</u> took place and ELEXIS EU shared impressions of this event with various followers.

In July 2021, both the <u>eLex conference</u>: <u>post-editing lexicography</u> and the <u>Lisbon Summer</u> <u>School in Linguistics</u> took place, and <u>ELEXIS EU kept its audience up to date</u> via Twitter.

In September 2021, the EURALEX: Lexicography for Inclusion conference took place in a virtual setting, and ELEXIS EU tweeted actively.

However, the vast majority of followers in year 4 was not only collected in the months of the events (July & September 2021) described above, but also in February and March 2021, as indicated in Table 3 below.

5.1.2 Facebook Analysis

In the course of year four, ELEXIS EU published 360 postings on Facebook, earned 200 new page likes and 255 new page follows.

Table 4 below indicates that most postings were published in July 2021 (eLex conference). An analysis of the most popular postings on Facebook according to reach¹ (firstly) and engagements² (secondly) shows that the most successful postings are related to (community building and training) events in the field of lexicography:

The most thriving posting in year four informed the interested audience in November 2021 about <u>a free online webinar</u> that introduced the written British National Corpus 2014: The

posting reached 8.400 people on Facebook and had 714 post engagements. Accordingly, a vast majority of new followers and page likes could be collected in this time period (see Table 4 below).

A posting from March 2021 informed the audience about the <u>return of the Lisbon Summer School in linguistics 2021</u>: It reached 3.500 people and earned 280 engagements.

In July 2022, ELEXIS EU called for participation in the <u>fourth GLOBALEX workshop on Lexicography & Neology</u>, held in conjunction with <u>EURALEX 2022</u> conference. The posting reached 1.500 people and achieved 119 engagements. A posting from June 2021 about the <u>ELEXIS Showcase Event at the Accademia della Crusca</u> was very popular too, it reached 1.500 people and earned 311 post engagements.

Additionally, ELEXIS EU posted about the <u>ELEXIS workshop held at EURALEX</u> (in July 2022), the posting reached 1.300 people and earned 180 engagements.

In November 2021, ELEXIS EU opened the fifth and final call for research grants. The <u>Facebook posting</u> reached 1.200 people and earned 41 engagements.

5.1.3 Social Media Campaigns

In the fourth year of the project, ELEXIS EU continued publishing several campaigns that were introduced in the course of the previous years: Every Tuesday, the 'ELEXIS tool series' informed the audience about tools and services available with the hashtag #ELEXIStool on Facebook and Twitter.

In Autumn 2021, the LexMeet platform (see Chapter 1) was introduced to the scientific community, which was accompanied by a social media campaign featuring the hashtag #MeetELEXIS to draw users to visit and sign up on the website.

Additionally the 'ELEXIS lexicographic newsfeed' was highlighted monthly with a variety of postings and tweets in different languages that were sourced from the ELEXIS lexicographic newsfeed.

Also, the campaign highlighting the winners of a respective research grant obtained by the project could be followed in addition to portraits of several grant winners of call 4 and 5. Throughout the year, ELEXIS EU posted about new grant winner portraits and reports and highlighted new <u>publications by grant winners</u>.

After having introduced the #ELEXISobserver series in previous years, ELEXIS EU posted and tweeted content including this hashtag, if applicable: These posts were related to job openings, news from observing institutions or events organised by them.




Figure 5: Overview of ELEXIS EU social media campaigns in year 4

For consistency, the authors included the announcement of 'ELEXIS news', such as new deliverables available, in Figure 5 below that provides an overview of ELEXIS social media campaigns in the course of year four.

5.2 Website Monitoring Year 4

In the course of year four, the project attracted 17,497 users who visited ELEXIS pages 41,016 times (see Table 5 below).




Figure 6: Google Analytics - Page visits per month February 2021 - July 20, 2022

The vast majority of users visited the website in May 2021, September 2021, November 2021 and in the end of May/beginning of June 2022:

In May 2021, many people seeked to learn more about the richness of the ELEXIFINDER tool. In September 2021, the postponed EURALEX conference took place, which drew the users' attention to visiting the website. In November 2021, the ELEXIS TNA Committee opened the 5th call for travel grants which attracted users to visit the website. In the end of May/beginning of June 2022, many users visited the ELEXIS EU website to learn more about the ELEXIS Showcase Event, held in early June in a hybrid setting in Florence, Italy.

In reference to objective 1, *promotional activities*, the indicator targets more than 50 daily visits on the project website after M24, i.e. January 2020.

As mentioned above, WP7 uses Google Analytics to measure website visitors; however, the instruction to monitor monthly 'daily visits' per se is not included in the terminology used by Google Analytics. Hence WP7 decided to use 'daily average pageviews per month' instead to indicate daily visits from January 2020 until the end of July 2022 (i.e. the period after M24). The detailed overview per month, provided in Table 6, provides evidence that this target was met and is therefore 'satisfactory'.

5.3 E-Mail Monitoring Year 4

February 2021 - July 20, 2022




Figure 7: Audience growth on Mailchimp in year 4 over time



5.4 Evaluation: WP7 Achievements within Year 4

Besides the overall objectives and the key performance indicators to be achieved by the end of the ELEXIS project, WP7 was tasked with obtaining the targets described in Tables 2 (i.e. Objective 1) and 2a (i.e. Excerpt of objectives 2, 3 and 4 that apply to WP7). Each indicator of Table 2, Objective 1, (developing an infrastructure which will foster cooperation and knowledge exchange between different research communities in order to bridge the gap between lesser-resourced languages and those with advanced e-lexicographic experience) will be taken into account in the following subchapters.

Objectives related to scientific publications (Table 2a, Excerpt of Objectives 2, 3 and 4) are described in Section 5.4.4.

5.4.1 Evaluation of Research Visits

In total, the trans-national access committee opened five calls for research visit grants and received 50 proposals. Within these five calls the committee granted 27 winners. 20 research visits were completed on-site, one grant winner conducted their visit in a virtual setting, while six visits were cancelled. More detailed information about the status of the research visits is accessible in D9.4, final report on trans-national access.

5.4.2 Evaluation of attendance at ELEXIS (training) events within Year 4

In Chapters 2.1 and 2.2, we provided an overview of ELEXIS branded training measures and events held in the course of year 4, Table 7 below presents a list of those events, indicating the number of participants per event. Altogether, ELEXIS EU project members organised 16 ELEXIS branded events: 8 training measure events, 1 community building event and 7 ELEXIS branded events in the form of a conference and hands-on workshops.

According to Table 2 (Objective 1), the targeted outcome of attendance at ELEXIS training events is monitored via the number of registrations per event >= 40.

Even though we are listing training measures in the upper part of Table 7 above, where the number of participants was lower than 40, the authors argue that this is to be considered 'satisfactory' since the number of participants (at most of the training events) was restricted (to less than 40 people).

The targeted outcome of attendance at ELEXIS community building events is measured via the number of registrations per event >= 100 (see Table 2, Objective 1).

Table 7 indicates the number of registrations (220) for the ELEXIS Showcase Event 2022. Hence, the requirements of this key performance indicator were met, the target may be classified as 'satisfactory' too.



5.4.3 Evaluation of Attendance at All Events in Year 4

(including ELEXIS-branded events, training events and third-party events)




Figure 8: Number of attended events per type in year 4 according to the ECAS portal

We gave an overview of ELEXIS-branded community building events and training measures as well as attended third-party and joint events in Chapter 2. Figure 8 below includes all of theses events and furthermore visualises the number of attended events per type according to the ECAS portal³:

In the course of year four, ELEXIS researchers (co-)organised 8 training measures (see Table 7 above) and participated in 6 workshops. Additionally, ELEXIS researchers published 20 videos in regards to training measures organised online via YouTube (i.e. the recordings of the LiSeH Spring School 2021 organised in a playlist (here) and the Lisbon Summer School in Linguistics 2021 video teasers: Introduction to Linked Open Data in Linguistics / The past, present and future, of dictionaries for African Languages). Furthermore, the project consortium members published the stream-recordings of the ELEXIS Showcase event held in Florence, Italy, on YouTube and provided the cut versions of each talk on videolectures.net.

Various ELEXIS EU members attended 12 conferences in the fields of lexicography, natural language processing and language technology respectively either onsite or online in the course of year 4. Moreover, the project members (co-)organised 3 conferences (eLex 2021, ELEXIS Showcase Event 2022, EURALEX 2022) and 7 workshops (GWLN2021 & GWLN2022: Globalex Workshop on Lexicography & Neology, the ELEXIS pre EURALEX conference workshop and 5 workshops at LREC, one of them jointly organised with other EU projects). In addition, ELEXIS joined forces with other EU projects at the ProLingKNOWER Workshop (with Nexus Linguarum) and the SSH Industry Outreach event (with CLARIN ERIC and DARIAH EU). The events other than a conference or a workshop that project members participated in, are lectures held by these researchers within the framework of master degrees that can be obtained at universities: the European Master in Lexicography - Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degree (with two open lectures at the Universidade do Minho, Portugal) and the Introduction to Digital Humanities (University Vienna, Austria). Last but not least, ELEXIS researchers participated in an exhibition, the Long Night of Research 2022 (Lange Nacht der Forschung), which takes place every two years in locations all over Austria: Researchers are invited to present their ongoing work and projects across various scientific disciplines to the general public. Hence, ELEXIS researchers participated in the 2022 onsite event with an ELEXIS booth.

(according to the ECAS portal)




Figure 9: Number of people reached at attended events in year 4

The number of people reached at these events is visualised in Figure 9 below: The vast majority of people reached includes the scientific community. However, at the <u>SSH Industry Outreach Event</u>, representatives from the industry could be reached. Additionally, we reached out to and are in contact with various representatives of companies, thanks to the LexMeet community: we count various companies among the members of the LexMeet platform, such as AIMEN Technology Centre, Kielikone Oy or Oxford University Press. In addition, ELEXIS was able to reach out to the General Public due to the participation in the Long Night of Research 2022.

February 2021 - July 20, 2022

5.4.4 Evaluation of Scientific Output




Figure 10: Growth of the Number of Publications over time (2018 - 2022)

Hereinafter, we will relate to the objectives regarding scientific output that were described in the Grant Agreement. However, it is not always easy to assign an article or conference paper to a single objective, because there may be some overlap. Thus, multiple assignments were possible. The numbers might still change slightly for the final reporting. A full list of publications (export from the ECAS portal) can be found in the Appendix. Figure 10 below provides an overview of the growing number of publications in the course of the project, from 2018 - 2022.
